We planned a wide range of restorative and uplifting activities, including:

**Glass Painting** - a calm and creative session that allowed staff to slow down, express themselves through art, and experience the mindful benefits of focusing on the present moment.



**Mini-Massages and Facials** - provided by a local beautician, these sessions were all about giving back to those who give so much. A chance to unwind, be pampered, and feel cared for.





Cold Water Immersion Therapy our brave staff took on the ice bath challenge! Cold water therapy is known to boost mood, reduce stress, and improve circulation — and it certainly sparked a lot of laughs (and screams!).

These activities weren't just about fun, each one promoted one or more of the five ways to wellbeing: connect, be active, take notice, keep learning, and give.



We are committed to supporting the mental health of everyone in our community. Mental Health Awareness Week was a brilliant reminder that when we take care of each other, we thrive together.



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We are incredibly proud to share that a group of our pupils have become the first ever cohort at Great Howarth School to achieve the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award - a truly remarkable milestone!

The Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) Award is one of the UK's most respected youth development programmes. Designed to support young people aged 14 to 24, it encourages them to push boundaries, grow in confidence, and gain skills that last a lifetime.



To achieve the Bronze Award, our pupils had to complete four key sections:

**Physical** – taking part in regular physical activity, building fitness, motivation and wellbeing.

**Skills** – developing a new personal skill such as cooking, art, or a creative hobby.



**Volunteering** – giving back to the community through acts of kindness, support or service.

**Expedition** – planning and undertaking a journey, including navigation, and teamwork.

The culmination of this journey memorable was and challenging expedition to Conwy Castle in North Wales. Surrounded by the stunning of the Welsh scenery countryside, our pupils navigated their route, carried their gear, and supported one another every step of the way. It was a genuine test of independence and cooperation – and one they passed with flying colours.



Our pupils demonstrated determination, adaptability and leadership, all of which are crucial as they prepare for the next stage of their lives.





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More than just a certificate, the DofE Award represents a huge step in each young person's journey towards adulthood.

The award builds self-esteem, communication skills, resilience and responsibility; all qualities that will serve them well in education, employment and beyond.



For many of our pupils, this has been a genuinely transformative experience, and they have proved to themselves and others what they are truly capable of.

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#### **Building Essential Skills for Life**

At Great Howarth School, we are committed to preparing our pupils not just for academic success, but for life beyond the classroom. That's why we've embraced the Skills Builder Framework - a powerful, structured approach to developing the essential soft skills that young people need for the world of work, further education, and independent living.

The Skills Builder Universal Framework breaks down eight key employability and life skills into teachable, measurable steps. These are the skills that employers consistently value, and the ones our pupils will rely on every day in adult life. The eight essential skills are:



















Rather than being treated as 'add-ons', these skills are woven into our curriculum, routines and culture. Whether it's through project work, daily interactions, careers education or enrichment activities, pupils are explicitly taught what each skill looks like, how to improve it, and why it matters.

For example, a group project might focus on teamwork and leadership, while a class debate helps pupils build speaking and listening skills. In practical subjects like food tech or enterprise, pupils naturally practice problem solving, creativity, and staying positive when things don't go to plan all of which are recognised and celebrated using the Skills Builder language and framework.

For many of our pupils, navigating the social and emotional world of work can be just as challenging as any academic task. By breaking each skill down into manageable, concrete steps, Skills Builder gives our young people a clear pathway to progress.



The framework helps to build confidence, self-awareness and independence while giving them tools they'll need in interviews, work placements and developing for adult relationships.



Skills Builder isn't just framework – it's a mindset. And by embedding it into everyday life at Great Howarth, we're helping our young people grow into thoughtful, capable and employable young adults who believe in their ability to succeed.




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#### **Arts & Crafts Festival 2025**

Wherever your next chapter takes you, you'll always be part of Great Howarth.





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




