Displays	Careers Education, Information, Advice, and Guidance (CEIAG) displays are strategically placed throughout the school, featuring content such as labour market insights, career pathways, post-16 and post-18 options, skill development, and application guidance.	CEIAG displays boost student awareness of career options and pathways, inspire aspirations, and support skill development. They foster informed decision-making, create discussions, meet guidance standards, and promote readiness for life beyond school.	1,2,4
Morrisby	The Morrisby platform is an online career guidance tool that helps students explore their strengths, interests, and aspirations through a series of assessments. It offers the students personalised career and education suggestions based on their results, labour market information, and tools for creating action plans enabling students to make informed decisions about their futures. Students can also research different Job profiles to give them a greater understanding of different job roles, requirements and what is involved.	The Morrisby platform empowers students with a deeper understanding of their strengths and potential career paths, boosting confidence and motivation.
